2:00 PM to 3:00 PM More looking at micros.

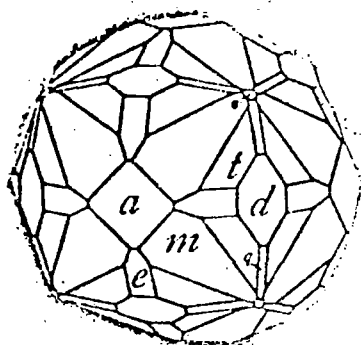
3:00 to 4:00 PM Slide program of micro slides by Gil George.

From the south, take the Southeast Expressway, take exit marked "Somerville-Cambridge", from here follow signs marked "Storrow Drive"- then follow previous directions.
