

MICROTIP -- Janet Cares

Labels for micromounts are necessarily small. To save space when lettering, consider using the two-letter abbreviations for states which have been approved by the Post Office. On a one-inch label, the abbreviation Mais more likely to fit than Massachusetts, or Mass., OT than Connecticut, or Conn., and so on. Below is the list of two letter abbreviations approved by the Postal Service.

MONT ST-HILAIRE: AN APPEAL

Collectors at Mont St-Hilaire are finally to be rewarded for their patience. As many of you know, a publication is now underway to be authored by Dr. Joseph Mandarino of the Anyal Ontario Museum in Toronto, and illustrated by the photographs of Vi Anderson, who is well known for her work by readers of the Mineralogical Record (especially March/April, 1979, p. 103) and Rocks & Minerals (see Sept./Oct., 1981, p. 197). It will be published in England by the Cambridge University Press. Many people, both professional and amadeur have contributed to this work, which should be the definitive reference for this world-renowmed locality.

The original contract calls for 50 each of color and black and white photographs. In the belief that color is essential to do justice to the beautiful and unusual minerals from this locality, at the January-meeting our members voted to support the cost of at least one color print, the exact amount to be voted on when more information became available. By coincidence a letter was already in the mail from Joe and VI with an appeal for funds, giving an estimated cost of \$100 to \$150 (US) for each color print. Donations In US funds may be sent to Marcelle Weber, or in Canadian dollars directly to VI Anderson at the addresses given below. Contributions from individuals are welcomed, even though only a fraction of the cost of one color print. Some of our members are already planning small mineral-related projects which will generate a profit to be earmarked for this cause.

According to Vi there are five months left before all material must be in the hands of the publisher. "An early pledge of a forthcoming gift would be of great help to me since I cannot select the correct number of colour slides to be used if I have no idea of what mometary resources are available." She adds "Should any unforeseen event prevent the publication of the book, the contributions would be returned to the donor may be included outlining the conditions of the gift as suggested above: (1) money to be restricted to colour prints (2) such money to be returned to donor should publication not take place.....Be assured your assistance will be clearly acknowledged in the St-Hialiar book,"
