Wishbones, Jawbones, Knucklebones, and Backbones.

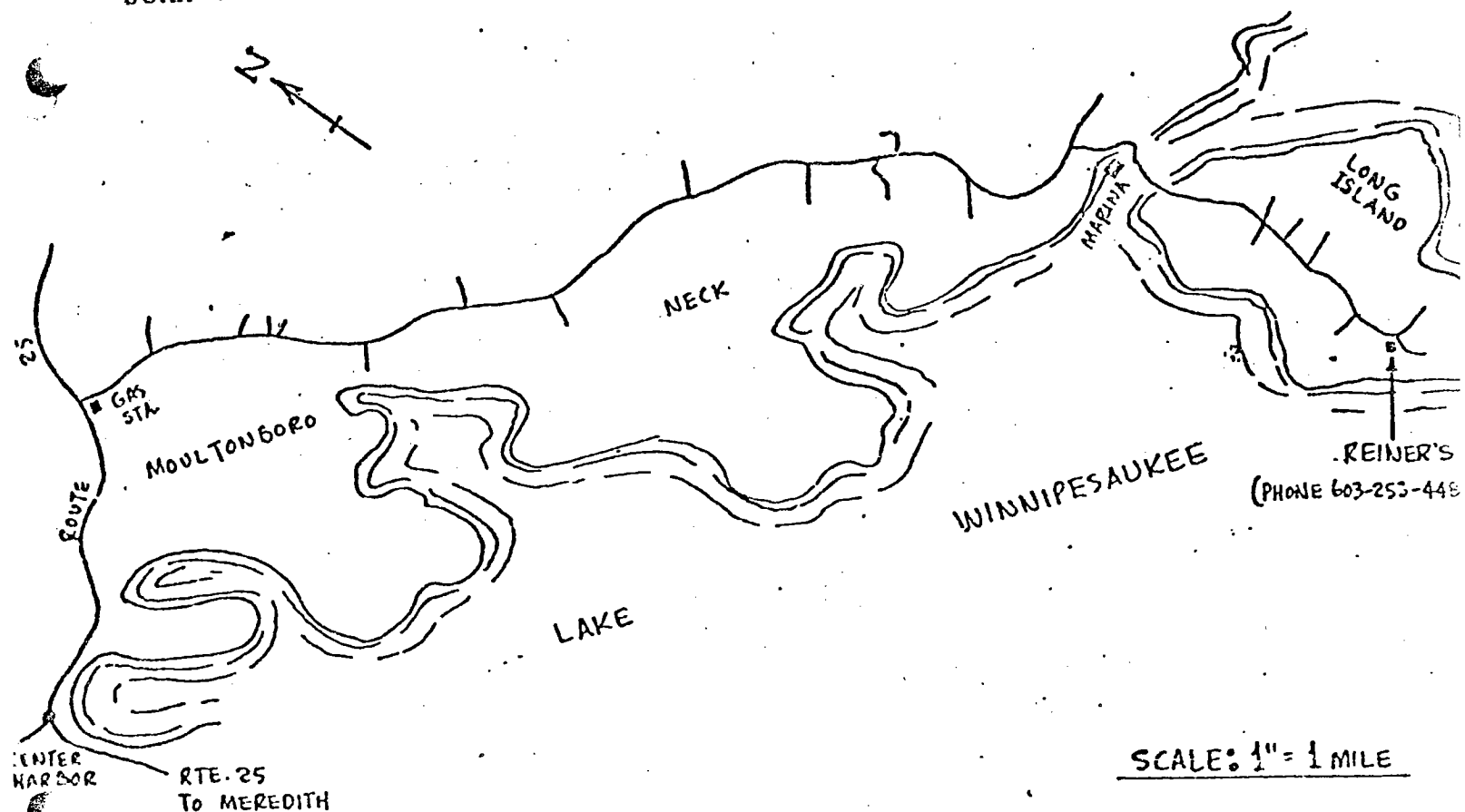
The wishbones spend their time wishing somebody else would do the work.
