Micromounters of New England May 2007 Meeting

The Grand May Meeting of the Micromounters of New England assembled at the Hudson, MA Elks Hall on Saturday, May 19th with twenty-seven members and three guests in attendance.

The day began with coffee provided by Mary's Catering and member-donated baked goods. During the AM hours members settled down to a morning of socializing and "scoping". It is always a wonderful opportunity to see and to talk to the truly, long distance "old friends" that cannot travel to the usual monthly meetings. Between the chitchat, members made countless trips to the giveaway table and the sales table throughout the morning hours. The silent auction table attracted bid after bid for a variety of donated items such as mineral CD's, bulk micro material as well as a few full-sized specimens. A beautiful Namibian beryl generated some keen competition.

The buffet lunch began promptly at noon with a generous assortment of hot meats, pasta, salads and drink offered by the catering service. No one appeared to complain about the quantity or the quality. Watermelon refreshingly rounded out the lunch. At shortly after 1 PM a short business meeting was convened (*see report on page 4*).

Guest speaker Jim Nizamoff then presented an informative and thoroughly entertaining presentation entitled "The Palermo Pegmatites", the theme for which Jim received his Masters degree at the University of New Orleans. Jim briefly discussed the age of the pegmatite assemblages, the primary phosphate minerals, their manner of occurrence, differences between the #1 and #2, and the paragenesis of the large variety of secondary phosphates. He "threaded the needle" keeping a good balance for those that needed scientific explanation and for those that appreciated mineralogical aesthetics. This was the highlight of the day and all appeared to appreciate Jim's expertise and photography (see pictures on page 3).

As with past tradition, the program ended with the awarding of door prizes and the resolution of the silent auction.




