



The Micromineralogists of the National Capital Area have again sent us information regarding their Micromounters Conference. The conference will take place on April 3, 4, and 5, 1987. The pre-conference reception (on the 3rd) will be held at the Smithsonian's Museum of Natural History. The Saturday and Sunday sessions will take place at the Adult Education Center of Maryland University, Adelphi Road, University Boulevard and Campus Drive, College Park, Maryland. Speakers will include Dr. Dan Appleman of the Smithsonian talking about U.S. sponsored research voyages (in which J. D. Dana played approminent role); Dr. Lance Kearns talking about selected Virginia localities; Bob Jaxel talking on Minerals of Cornwall; and Lou Perloff showing a suite of his micromount slides. ************************************ FROM THE FEBRUARY ISSUE OF THE TRIASSIC VALLEY BULLETIN: THE MAGIC LIVES ON

In the hey-day of collecting at DeMix Quarry, Mt. St-Hilaire was, on occasion, referred to as "the Magic Mountain". The New Haven Mineral Club members who made a return visit October 4, 1986, after a 5-year absence, found there had been no end to the magic Collecting today is in the Poudrette Quarry; DeMix is inactive and closed to visitors. Toward the end of one season, the rock available to collectors one week-end was likely to be gone the next. As exasperating as that might be in some ways, it does mean that something new is likely to be available the next time...Where else can you go to collect more than 50 species on a week-end? Micro, true, for the most part -- but 50+ species and including some rareties. The list I made after looking over the material we brought back, follows:
