# Recycling/Flea Market



#### 21st ANNUAL ATLANTIC MICROMOUNTERS CONFERENCE -- APRIL 2, 3, 4, 1993

The Micromineralogists of the National Capital Area, Inc. again invite our members to their weekend conference that will feature volcanic minerals. Features for each day include:

Friday (at the Museum of Natural History, Smithsonian Institution) - slide program "Introduction to Volcanic Minerals" by Fred Schaefermeyer; home-cooked buffet; Graves and Zimmerman micromount collection open for viewing.

Saturday (at the University of Maryland, College Center for Adult Education) - lecture, "Fernandina Volcano, Galapagos Islands," by Tom Simkin; lecture, "Mineralogy of Sea Floor Chimney sulfides;" auction of microminerals; raffle drawings; dinner; and slide program, "Minerals of the European Volcanics," by Louis Perloff.

Sunday (same location as Saturday) - lecture, "Petrographic Studies of Mount St. Helens Pumice," by William Melson; 2nd annual Ruth Wertz Micromount Competition, slide show of winners, and vote for grand prize; and zeolite workshop, featuring microminerals from Rock Island Dam, Wenatchee, Washington, and Sugar Grove West Virginia.

Also available will be a dealers' room, giveaway tables, and swapping. Entrees for the micromount contest are DUE MARCH 12.

Very nice accommodations are available at the Adult Education Center. Reservations must be made by March 12. Please register in advance for this conference.

The Micromounters of New England meet regularly every month except for June, July, August and December. Informal meetings are held in July and August. The May meeting is a pre-registered event. Dates and locations of regular meetings are printed in the bulletin. Advance notice of the next month's meeting appears on the front page, lower left-hand corner. Arrival land departure times vary with each location, but are not usually earlier than 9 AM and later than 5 PM. Members bring along microscopes, lights and minerals for study, trade and possible identification. Members provide their own lunch (except for the May meeting); the club provides coffee/tea. Dues are due on January 1st of each year and are \$6.00 per member.
