DECEMBER 2005 WEB PAGE UPDATE

Approaching the new year, the Micromounters of New England Pages (<http://www.micromountersofnewengland.org>) have been up almost three months. After nearly 90 days of operation, the bottom line statistic is that we average 10 visits per day with a typical visitor viewing 6.83 web pages. The main index page has been visited well over 300 times, the Articles, Photos, Links and Calendars each are about 100 visits.

In our humble beginning most work has taken place in two areas. First, I am fairly pleased with the breakdown of pages as they are now. Menus along the top of every screen get the visitor to our offerings with a minimum of mouse clicks. Pages are ordered chronologically or alphabetically where the option presents itself. I am not using lots of colors or graphics intensive features that cause slower download times. I have spent some time restructuring these pages and trying to streamline the information. Secondly, the majority of MMofNE data has been loaded into the **members only area**. This data includes a wealth of articles from the Program Books from 1982 through 1992 that I scanned and converted to Adobe Acrobat PDF files. Also in the members area are newsletters. At this writing, we have 2003 – 2005 in Microsoft Word format. I am beginning to scan older years from paper copy into Acrobat files as well.

By far, the best part of our website is the members only area. In members only we have over 40 articles on methods and techniques, members, history and localities. There are also about two dozen mineral articles with excellent information. There are many great articles by past and present members as well as a few gems by well-known authors. Members only is a protected area that is not accessible to anybody without a password. All members of the MM of NE should visit this page. The generic login is MEMBER with a password of MMOFNE. I encourage one and all to visit and apprise me of any errors, omissions or bald-faced lies.

I have been given a wealth of paper information from Jim Cahoon. I have received submissions from Pat Barker and Gene Bearrs. I have been given permission to use photos by Scott Whittemore and Bob Janules. I continue to scan old articles and newsletters and welcome new pictures and articles from all members.

As a mineral enthusiast with minimal geological background, I enjoy the opportunity to help the club by giving back as best I can.

NB: Current Web Page Activity Data is enclosed in this Newsletter.

The **Newsletter** is the official publication of the Micromounters of New England (MMNE). The last by-laws revision was April 19, 2003. The MMNE is a member of the Eastern Federation of Mineralogical and Lapidary Societies (EFMLS) (<<http://www.amfed.org/efmls>>) and the American Federation of Mineralogical Societies (AFMS) (<http://www.amfed.org>). Material from the *Newsletter* may be copied in other rock and mineral publications if credit is given to the author and the *Newsletter* and permission has been obtained from the author. If there are questions regarding copying contact the editor. The club address is c/o the Secretary. Meetings are held monthly, September through May, except for December, and usually on an informal basis in July and August. Sites rotate and will be posted in the *Newsletter* as far in advance as possible. Visitors are welcome to attend all meetings. Bring a microscope and light source if you have one.

DUES are \$10/year for a single person and \$15/year for a family membership, levied on a calendar basis. The family membership includes two adults and all children under 18 living at the same address. One copy of the *Newsletter* will be sent on a family membership.

ELECTIONS FOR MMNE OFFICERS 2006-2007

The annual election of officers will be held at the April, 2006 MMNE meeting. A slate of officers will be created by the Executive Committee at the March, 2006 meeting. A ballot will be sent to all members in the April Newsletter. Balloting may be carried out via mail or in person at the April Meeting. All elected positions need to be filled with the exception of the 2005-2007 Director's slot. Please consider volunteering to be an officer of the MMNE. Duties have been distributed so that no one person has an undue burden. The duties of the officers were recently reviewed in this Newsletter. Note that we currently do not have a President, but hopefully one of our members will volunteer to assume that role.

FROM YOUR EDITOR

Effective June 30, 2006 I am tendering my resignation as Editor of the MMNE Newsletter. The Editor is appointed by the President, not elected, so please consider volunteering for the position. Over the past several years I have had the privilege of publishing the wonderful series of articles by Bob Janules on the Conway Granites. These articles have been coveted by Newsletter Editors around the country for publication in their local Newsletters. I have tried to find or create articles of interest to the Membership, but have often felt that there has been little interest in anything other than the next meeting date. Unfortunately, there have been few contributions from elsewhere within the membership.

The membership has made it clear that it wants at least a postcard every month. In the future, the presence of a web site, as a repository for articles, meeting dates, and other MMNE business can significantly reduce the activities of the Editor. I think that in the future we will need a Newsletter which lists mostly meeting dates and other occasional club related pieces of information. I suspect that more and more of the MMNE membership will have internet access so that the web site will take over as the posting site for almost all club happenings and information, and thus significantly decrease the job of the Editor. Traditionally a Newsletter has been published in September, October, November, January, February, March, April, May, and the beginning of the summer months. September and January issues are necessary to send out the meeting schedule for the following three months. In the March issue the membership roster and a sign-up sheet for the May Symposium are mailed. The April issue contains a ballot for the annual election of officers. The May issue is primarily a reminder for members to bring specimen material and other items for sales and give-aways at the symposium. Having said all this, do we really need a Newsletter in October, November, February and the beginning of summer unless there are articles or other special interest items to send out? Obviously the additional issues are nice, but if there is nothing to write about, they become an unnecessary burden for the editor and cost to the club.

One last thought – April and May are busy times for the club, what with elections, the May Symposium and the start of the field collecting season. Members often want their early spring weekends for collecting, not elections. Consider changing our club calendar to a match the true calendar year rather than the April to March calendar which we currently work by. Last year we could not muster enough warm bodies in April to even hold an election. If the elections are held in January, the meeting turnout will be at its high point. In addition, the new officers will not be brought in while all the preparations for the May meeting are underway.

Please assist your new editor by supplying an article or two. They do not need to be fancy or esoteric, just something which you, as a micromounter, would like to know about collecting or micromounting.



BANDWIDTH – Web space is sold with bandwidth and disk capacity in mind. I am happy to report we bought the minimum and are not even coming fractionally close to 5% of capacity.

These overview summaries for 5 months show we average fourteen visitors per day. While average page views per visitor is 1.71, I am sure that many first time visitors leave after viewing only the main page. People who find our site because they wanted to see it browse much more than one to two pages before exiting.

MMNE SECRETARIAL REPORT FOR 02/18/06

The Micromounter of New England February meeting convened at 12:10 PM at the Chelmsford, MA Public Library with thirteen members present. Gene Bearss conducted the meeting. There was no official January meeting due to the lack of a quorum. In the old business portion of the meeting Gene reported that Jim Nizamoff would not be available to be the speaker for the May Symposium. However, in an initial contact by club member Jim Warner, Joe Marty had expressed interest in being the Symposium presenter. Mr. Marty is the most recent inductee into the Micromounter Hall of Fame and specializes in the minerals and microminerals of Utah.

Treasurer, Anna Wilken, contacted Mr. Marty prior to the 02/18 meeting and reported that, indeed, he would be happy to make the trip east so long as his travel expenses were covered by the club. These would include airfare from Salt Lake City to Manchester, NH (and back), food and lodging. Anna indicated that she and husband Bob were willing to manage Mr. Marty's transportation to and from the airport and host him at their home. She also said that Mr. Marty charges no speaker fee. Gene Bearss suggested that the club could give an honorarium in the amount of the speaker fee to a worthy cause of Mr. Marty's choosing, one that would support our hobby in some way. The Treasurer said Mr. Marty had two programs to offer: "Gold Hill" and "Hidden Treasures of Utah", and that he could give one or perhaps both. Discussion ensued regarding the merits of one versus two programs. In the end the majority voted in favor of two programs, a shorter one in the morning and a longer one in the afternoon.

Gene Bearss made it clear that it was important to bring in donated items for the sales table to the March meeting so that it could be properly priced and organized. Give-aways would best be brought directly to the Symposium. Gene questioned whether we would have a silent auction as in years past. Mike Swanson said that, if so, items also should be brought to the March meeting so that the auction slips could be made up in advance.

In regard to Symposium advertising, Anna Wilken said she had gotten the Symposium information to the Rocks and Minerals calendar just at the deadline. It will also be listed in "Mineral News." Your Editor will be sending out a flier to New England Clubs and past (inactive) MMNE members.

Member Joe Mulvey said that he would be able to provide a digital projector for Mr. Marty's Power Point presentations.

Anna Wilken reported that she had e-mailed Mary's catering but had not received a response yet. When asked by Anna, members seemed satisfied with last year's menu.

With regard to new business, Tom Mortimer volunteered to do the Symposium program.

Janet Cares said she had a supply of old Symposium programs dating back to 1982 and that they could be bound together to sell. Joe Mulvey volunteered to bind the samples that Janet presented to him. Janet also announced that she had Rocks and Minerals dating back to 1978, and Mineralogical Record from volume twelve forward. She said anyone interested should "make an offer". She and her husband Steve also have large display cases with lighting available for free with the condition that they be picked up from their home. In addition a large rock trimmer is available. Webmaster Joe Mulvey announced to the Treasurer that he needs reimbursement for the website expense. For those who did not know the password for the club website it was suggested that they e-mail Joe and have it forwarded to them.

From I-495 Northbound


Take Exit 33 and turn right (South) at bottom of ramp onto Rte 4. Follow Rte 4 approximately ½ mile through several sets of lights to traffic island in center of town.

*Continue on Rte 4 to the right at the island and proceed past the Mobil station on your left (Note that you are on a one way street). The library is on the same island as the Mobil station. Continue on Rte 4 staying to the left for several hundred yards. The back side of the library is to your left. Take Rte 4 North, a left hand turn, and the library is the first building on the left. Park in the lot and enter through the front doors. The meeting room is to the right, just inside the entrance.

From I-495 South bound

Take exit 34 and turn right (South) at the bottom of the ramp onto Rte 110. Follow Rte 110 (Chelmsford Street) to junction of Rtes 110, 129, and 4. Go straight into Chelmsford Center, staying to the right of the Mobil station and follow directions from I-495 Northbound (*)
