#### MMNE SECRETARIAL REPORT FOR SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 16, 2008

(The following minutes are based on an MP3 recording of the meeting posted on the "Members" page of the MMNE website.)

The February meeting convened with eleven members present.

Mike Swanson announced that he had informed other officers that he has had to resign as club President due to "difficult personal family problems." Vice President, Joe Mulvey, stated he would be happy to take over the role of President for the remaining two-month period until April when new elections occur. In view of a question by Gene Bearss, Mike indicated that there should be no need for the election of an interim vice president for such a brief period.

Mike said that most everything was done that had to be done for the May Meeting. He said that Bill Henderson was set as the speaker and that Bill would be giving two short presentations and one longer one.

Joe Mulvey reported that he had investigated ways of displaying specimens from the microscope directly to a projector. He said that B & H Photo sold a device called the Ken-A-Vision Videoflex, which will do just that. He said that it could be attached to a laptop or a monitor as well. Joe indicated that the device was significantly discounted through B & H and cost \$359.

### February 2008 Secretary's report, continued from page 1

He said that one problem was that, with B & H, the club would not be able to preview it (in the event that it was not suitable) and return it without incurring a sizeable restocking fee. Questions were raised regarding the device's apparent odd configuration, its resolution and quality. Mike Swanson wondered whether Joe had looked into the equipment that Jim Ross sells through Absolute Clarity. Joe said he would do so prior to the April meeting and that he would also try to answer questions raised by members about the Ken-A-Vision product.

Mike Swanson asked club members if they had any locality or mineral species suggestions for the March meeting topical presentation. Gene Bearss suggested minerals from the Moat miarolitic cavities. No objections were raised. Bob Janules wondered about the date of the next meeting. It was determined to be March 15<sup>th</sup>.

Because some members have photos in 35 mm slide form, a discussion developed regarding ways to transfer them to a digital format. Tom Mortimer said that there was a little device available for \$99 that would allow one to do it. He indicated that it was "not a speedy process" but that it worked. He said that once in digital format one could display them via Windows XP Slide Show or Microsoft Power Point. They could also be stored to disk. Not being able to be present in March, Tom said he would bring the device to the April meeting.

Joe Mulvey said that members could start to bring donations for the May Meeting sales table in March. Anna Wilken asked Tom if he had the file that explains the color price coding for the sales table minerals. Tom said he didn't but that since it was published in the bulletin last year it would be easily retrieved.

The February meeting adjourned. Tom Mortimer followed with a digital presentation of Palermo minerals gleaned from Mindat.com

## Microscope Digital Camera Considered for Club Purchase

Club member Joe Mulvey has been researching the purchase of a microscope adaptable digital camera for use at our meetings. Joe contacted Bob Dykes of Ken-A Vision Mfg Co., Inc. to learn more about their digital camera offering. The following are some excerpts from his email dialog with Bob Dykes, (*Bob's response is in blue italic print*):

The Micromounters of New England, <a href="http://www.micromountersofnewengland.org/">http://www.micromountersofnewengland.org/</a> a microscopic mineral study group that has been around for about 40 years. In mineral circles we are rather famous because some of our founding members contributed so greatly to the discovery of new minerals.

I have been charged with the goal of finding a method of allowing a member to bring in specimens (micros) and be able to display them at will using our 'scope and projector.

We now have a nice Panasonic projector that connects to most video devices.

I saw the Flex-cam digital and have a few questions.

- 1. The price seems much lower than what I and other members expected. While this does seem to be an educational tool, we are leery that it may not live up to expectations.
- 2. What is the resolution of the camera? I saw 500 lines which makes me think the resolution is rather low fair for screen display, not so good for taking pictures of photo quality.
- \* 500 lines equates to approx. 640 x 480 in digital resolution. For photo quality images, I recommend, 1024X768 or above. Our model 7200UM has 1280 x 960 SXGA resolution. \*his requires the use of a computer\*
- 3. How exactly do I attach the camera to the microscope? Does it overlay the ocular or do we remove it and the camera fits inside?

Our Video Flex products have a built-in 34.5mm eyepiece adapter and ships with a 28mm eyepiece adapter which fits over the existing microscope eyepiece.

4. Is there anywhere around Massachusetts and New Hampshire that we might see this device? I am nervous to recommend the club buying some of these sight unseen!

We have a stocking distributor in Lititz, PA. – NewComm Technologies (ph# 717-626-8448) that can arrange for one of their people in your area contact you to set up a product demo

5. Based on what I have said is there a different product would you recommend?

For a microscope/Camera + projector setup I would recommend the MVP-150 which has 1024x768

resolution through its VGA connection. If you have a computer, you can take advantage of our Megapixel

Digital Video Flex (model 7200UM) which has 1280x960 SXGA resolution for a microscope/Camera +

Computer + projector setup.


