MMNE Secretarial Report

April 21, 2007 by Bob Wilken

The April 2007 meeting of Micromounters of New England came to order at 11:30 AM with fifteen members and one guest attending. This was the club's first meeting at the Trinity Lutheran facility in Chelmsford. The membership thanks President Mortimer for all his work in screening and previewing a variety of church locations in the area. Gene Bearss noted that Tom went above and beyond the call of duty.

In the absence of Tom Mortimer, Vice President Mike Swanson presided. The first order of business was a vote for the slate of candidates for 2007-08. A motion was made to accept the ballot as published in the MMNE newsletter. It was seconded and all present approved. Mike Swanson was elected President; Joe Mulvey, Vice President; Anna Wilken, Treasurer and Bob Wilken, Secretary.

There was general consensus that the Trinity Lutheran location was a fine one. Some members wondered if a little larger room might be available. The suggestion also was made that we rent for one hour longer. But, all agreed that the location was central and that there was easy access from the outside.

Discussion followed regarding the newsletter. Gene Bearss said that he continues to have difficulty receiving the newsletter in one piece because of the postal department's "glopata-glopata" machine. He felt that those who receive the newsletter by standard mail should have it put in a standard, business-sized envelope. Mike Swanson said that dues should be raised a little to cover any newsletter expenses since this has always been the way of covering newsletter costs. Another suggestion was made to publish a plea to the membership to ask for ONLY the e-mailed version of the bulletin to help reduce cost.

Mike Swanson questioned whether all was set for the May meeting. The Secretary indicated that Anna Wilken had arranged for the caterer who would also set up the morning coffee. Members donate morning snacks and goodies. Gordon Jackson volunteered to man the silent auction. Anna Wilken would bring in the auction forms. Joe Mulvey said that he would have the projector and all needed equipment for speaker Jim Nizamoff. Mike stated that it was imperative that directions and a map for the May meeting be included in the May bulletin. Hal Herard said that several people had already brought in giveaways and sales table material. Those bringing sales material directly to the May meeting should have labeling and color-coding for price. Gene Bearss said he would have door prize material but others are also encouraged to contribute. It was also noted that members should arrive early enough to help set up tables and chairs.

SPEAKER PRESENTATION


James Nizamoff will be the featured speaker at the Grand May Meeting of the Micromounters of New England on Saturday, May 19.


His presentation will focus on the pegmatology and mineralogy of the Palermo 1 & 2 Mines. The professional in geological sciences as well as to the mineral collector alike knows Jim. He started as a mineral collector at age seven in Putnam, Connecticut and went on to earn his Master of Science in Geology from the University of New Orleans. One of his prime research interests has been phosphate mineralogy and paragenesis of granitic pegmatites around the world. In the course of his academic career he has given innumerable oral presentations at the Rochester Symposia with many of them (as well as others) published in *Rocks and Minerals* and *The Mineralogical Record*. Jim has had wide ranging field experience from the Maine Pegmatite Camp, to work in Madagascar and field work in Namibia, Brazil and across the United States. He is currently working as a mineralogist for Omya, Inc. in Vermont.
